

Sussex-Warren Area Energy Cooperative Community Energy Aggregation Program

PROGRAM UPDATE

November 1, 2021

Dear Stillwater Township Resident,

In April 2018, Stillwater Township, in conjunction with the Sussex-Warren Area Energy Cooperative ("SWAEC"), established a Community Energy Aggregation Program. The program is designed to save residents money on the supply portion of their electric bills, and since the program began, participating residents have saved over \$1,991,750. The cooperative includes thirteen (13) participating municipalities and represents over 14,782 households.

The contract that the Sussex-Warren Area Energy Cooperative (SWAEC) with IDT Energy Inc. to furnish your electric supply through the Community Energy Aggregation Program is ending on December 31, 2021. Since the program is ending, all accounts must be returned to the utility, JCP&L's Basic Generation Service at the end of the contract term.

## Here's What Happens Next:

Your electric supply service will be returned to your local utility company, JCP&L. This will happen with the next meter reading on or after December 31, 2021. No action is required on your part. Your electric service will continue uninterrupted.

We will keep residents informed of the return of the program at a future date. All information about a new program will be mailed to eligible residents via First Class mail through the US Postal Service. Please remember that no one will call you on the telephone or knock on your door with information regarding the SWAEC Community Energy Aggregation Program.
